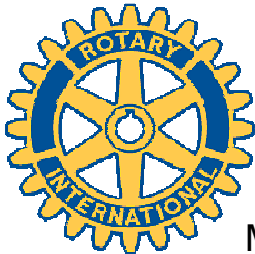

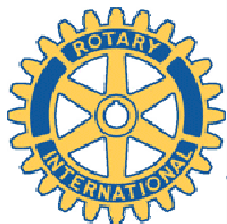

About the Health Authority

The Detroit Wayne County Health Authority was established by Governor Jennifer Granholm in 2003, with the recommendation of the Wayne County Stabilization Work Group, in response to clear indications of a health care safety net crisis in Detroit and Wayne County. The Health Authority was created by an Interlocal Agreement between the City of Detroit, the County of Wayne, and the Michigan Department of Community Health under the Urban Cooperation Act of 1967. The agreement was approved by Detroit City Council and the Wayne County Board of Commissions and signed in 2004. The agreement enables the Health Authority to serve the needs of the uninsured and underinsured in Detroit and Wayne County.

Mission

Coordinate efforts to meet the health needs of the uninsured and underinsured residents in the City of Detroit and Wayne County by assuring access and improving the health status of all people.

Vision

Create an organization recognized locally, statewide and nationally for its ability to develop and sustain an effective safety net service delivery system for the uninsured and underinsured populations of the City of Detroit and Wayne County.

This will be accomplished through the coordination of primary care and preventive health services; the establishment of "medical home" providers to assure continuity of care to residents regardless of where they live; the maximization of private and public resources, and the cooperation and collaboration of all stakeholders on health services and public health issues.

How is the Health Authority financed?

Although it is a public corporation, the Health Authority does not receive direct public funding. Its funding comes through contractual arrangements with health systems for Medicaid enrollment services and related matching grants from the Medicaid program. It also receives funds from corporate and philanthropic organizations such as Blue Cross Blue Shield Foundation, the McGregor Fund, and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. General community donations help build the Community Education Fund, providing an alternative source of revenue to help promote community health resources in the area, as well as community health services such as school physical programs.
